Children's Environmental Health Network

The Children's Environmental Health Network is a national, multidisciplinary organization dedicated to protecting the fetus and the child from environmental hazards and to promoting a healthy environment. The Network is composed of experts in the fields of medicine, nursing, research and policy from national health and child organizations. These experts serve on the Network's Advisory Board and Committees.

The Network has been working on the national level since 1992 in the following areas:

- **Educating** key audiences— including health care professionals, policymakers, and community members—about the environmental health needs of children.
- Advancing **research** on the health effects for children of environmental exposures and innovative prevention strategies, and forging links between researchers and others working on behalf of children.
- Promoting sound, child-focused, prevention-based, public health **policy** regarding environmental and children's health.

The Network produces and distributes a variety of publications and materials including the Resource Guide on Children's Environmental Health (www.cehn.org/cehn/resourceguide/rghome.html). The Resource Guide provides information and links on national and local organizations that are working to protect children from environmental health hazards; sources of data and information on environmental hazards, health effects, and exposure routes; internet sites that provide information on and ways to be involved in children's environmental health; search tools to locate related scientific articles; and a glossary of children's environmental health terms.
